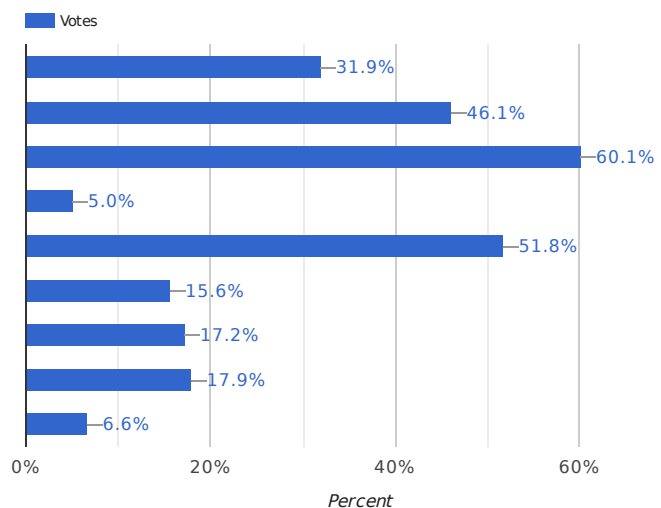

I don't feel that Plymouth City Center is much of a gathering place now. It has services... but there is not a home town feel as there is in Arbor Lakes area--which I think is nice with mix of restaurants and shops that you can walk around to.

Another gym would be nice. Lifetime is so busy but nice. LA fitness or YMCA would be great.

I'm looking forward to in-door walking path for the winter. Would much prefer it over dome and mall. Dome is not open all the time and cold when it's below 15 degrees. Mall is far and not ideal for walking.

Need more fun non-chain restaurants, wine bars and breweries

Traffic could be improved, there should be a more direct way through than going through the Cub Foods parking lot and around.

More ethnic businesses. It is so white American focused. Plymouth is such a diverse community, but that just isn't reflected in the businesses in the City Center. They are all so homogeneous that it is bland and boring to go there.

Fast casual food that's family owned versus chain

Stop putting in so many fast food restaurants. Sit downs are nice. Plymouth does not have a "nice" downtown area like other cities close by...it is a shame.

I typically do not go to City Center because I live on the very northern edge of Plymouth much closer to Arbor Lakes. I will stop there on our way home from church or when I get my hair done. We really like the movie theater and that is our #1 go to theater....especially when they have Senior Tuesdays.

Plymouth City Center isn't walker or biker friendly. Cars exceed the speed limit and don't observe traffic signals. It also needs more trees and greenery.

As noted elsewhere, the parking lot designs are not good. Near Lunds/Noodles, there are three or four distinct sets of lots that are set up like walled cities. Stop the libertarian division of land and solve the tragedy of the parking lot commons. Also, Plymouth appears to be where restaurants go to die. No restaurant site should be vacant for more than a few months.

I like that Hilde and the surrounding area is so inviting. I'd like to see the area expand and be less car-friendly on the interior and more pedestrian.

Not sure the genesis of this survey: you could have helped the businesses at City Center by not following along with the nonsense mandates that the state put out during corona virus....

Keep greenspace incorporated as we need to keep natural habitat and spaces for our community.

I appreciated the inclusion of Health and Wellness and it made me think more about services that are missing to be more proactive with our mental health. Creative Art Therapies - art, music, dance/movement, play, etc. Culinary arts. Nutrition. Ways to create together, as a community and family, and share with others. Places like The Marsh in Minnetonka.

Consider a public parking ramp.

It is a collection of strip malls and buildings and not anything like a downtown like the ones in Hopkins or Wayzata.

It would be interesting to know what could be done with the old Ruby Tuesday building near the Lunds. It has been vacant for many years.

More parking for hilde when there are events.

Having a fun walkable mainstreet would be great! Think Maple Grove, Hopkins. With restaurants that aren't fast food or chains. Breweries or tap rooms to visit and hang out. Green spaces too and a park!

It is a MUST that you make a pedestrian friendly crossing across Vicksburg and Hwy 55. Totally amazed that no one has been killed there yet.

Please keep the bocce ball courts!

Improve traffic flow. Sync traffic lights so smoother flow.

It feels very separated and not really like a downtown. It would be nice if there were more local businesses and fun family events

Need more interesting shops and a better walking system so people can park and walk around safely.

Indoor play place similar to Williston tree house could be cool. Maybe indoor mini golf for winter kids activities

The Lunds/BWW/Chipotle/Noodles parking lot configuration is terrible, so I avoid that shopping center entirely. The Chipotle/Noodles parking dead-ends. The stop sign setup near Chipotle is unusual and causes accidents.

Needs a gun store.

Wish it was more like downtown Wayzata or even like a mini Stillwater w/unique shops and restaurants all within a reasonable walking distance. Plymouth is too chopped up and it's not easy to walk between shops/restaurants without being on a major road.

Get businesses to be accountable for safety factors. Cub parking lot has not replaced a Stop Sign in exiting in SW corner of their lot. Reported it to management several times over couple years. Haven't done my homework because know where I'm going, however, require all businesses to have their address numerals clearly on their building. (Don't want to be dependent on electronics.)

Great use of space to give Plymouth residents the feeling of community in a spread out suburb

make it truly a city center. Use parking lots for food truck nights Advertise it as a city center with activities besides hide. What about shutting down one street for activities? Make it be a gathering area.

Would love to have it better designed so families can bike or walk there but also want to go there. Outdoor areas to sit, Independent restaurants and coffee shops. Things that would make Plymouth unique. Right now there is no reason to go to the City Center. We drive to the library, but it would be great to bike or walk and then be able to walk to something else nearby worth hanging out at. I am not sure who owns the buildings, but it would be nice to have some personality to them versus them all looking the same. Right now you cannot tell the difference between any of the buildings except by reading the signs. Outdoor seating restaurants/coffee shops with actual patios would be amazing! I believe you would need some incentive for small independent businesses to come in there but would also need incentives for the current companies to move a bit further out. People drive to insurance companies, doctors, dentists, investment firms--move them further out. Make it a unique instead.

Bring back SMA Style concerts to Hilde. The Soul Asylum concert in 2017 was great!

It takes too long to get across 55 by car, and dangerous by bike or walking. Not sure how to remedy this, but I would definitely go to the City Center more often if it didn't take so long to get across Hwy 55.

I had to look up online what you meant by City Center. I don't consider that the center of Plymouth as the only reason I go there is for pilates and the library. I always thought the city made a mistake by making all of those small buildings by Cub offices - they should've been shops and nice little restaurants, like Maple Grove/Edina/Hopkins/Wayzata. You need to add actual restaurants and not all of this quick food. Plymouth is a drive through town - not at all a downtown or a destination. Why do we get stuck with Chickfila when other areas get unique local restaurants?

Please improve the restaurants in Plymouth. The current selection is horrible!

Since I'm on the far eastern side of Plymouth, I'm much closer to Golden Valley and tend to go there more than Plymouth. But I love the movie theater and Hilde Center. I wish the circumstances were such that I could go to movie events at the Hilde!

Too many offices and doctors offices. Need retail and restaurants.

What defines the City Center?

Thank you for asking about the Plymouth City Center. We need an 18 hole golf course, like other cities!

It's such a disjointed area. The parts don't seem to fit together and because of the busier roads without a walking bridge going between the library and say the post office feels far - like a car ride rather than a walk.

It's a longer drive than I would want to do for most services and shopping. There isn't a lot of those amenities in the northeastern area of Plymouth.

I would like to see more people using masks. I don't feel safe from COVID to go to some businesses because people don't wear masks.

Would love to see more economic development like arbor lakes vs more housing

Would love if you added a Home Goods store and some more quick healthy restaurants.

Vicksburg and Highway 55 could be safer. Ideally there would be a pedestrian bridge to cross over the top of the highway. Another idea that I have seen in a town is some sort of "crawl", especially during the fall or winter months there could be a collaboration of some different businesses to put on a hot chocolate crawl, or something that they have more in common. Food brings communities together. :)

Before you begin a survey like this, you should include your definition of Plymouth City Center. I had to google and find the defined boundary to be able to answer the survey. I live a mile from Plymouth City Center and was not familiar with that description.

Not many people know that there *is* a City Center, or a Main Street of sorts. So maybe make it better promoted?

Plymouth City Center is a concept that seems poorly defined. If the idea is to do more of what's already there that's not much an improvement. If the idea is to make something better what exactly is that? I'm afraid we are on a path to more of the same not something new and innovative.

Make it very clear where Hilde Center is - AND PROVIDE MORE PARKING!!
